AAESA 2010-2011 SCHOOLS OF CHOICE **105**

First Trimester/Semester

(Allegan, Fennville, Glenn, Hopkins, Martin, Otsego, Plainwell, Wayland)

1. Each school district within the Allegan Area Educational Service Agency (AAESA) shall determine annually if it will accept non-resident students from within the AAESA. If so, the school district shall also determine the available grades, schools, and special programs, as well as the number of student openings.
2. As permitted by the Schools of Choice law, districts may deny enrollment to any student who has been suspended within the past two years, or has ever been expelled from a school.
3. If the Schools of Choice “**105**” applications exceed the space availability for the grade, school or special program, there shall be a random lottery drawing conducted under the supervision of the Allegan County Schools of Choice Committee. Enrollment preferences shall be given to previous Schools of Choice enrollees and other school-aged children from the same household.
4. If a district has a **limited number of openings**, the parent(s)/guardian(s) shall complete and submit an AAESA Schools of Choice “105” application no later than **August 6, 2010** for the first semester. The application form shall be submitted to the superintendent’s office of the AAESA for processing and for inclusion in the lottery drawing.
5. If a district has an **unlimited number of openings**, the parent(s)/guardian(s) shall complete and submit an AAESA Schools of Choice “105” application no later than **September 10, 2010** for the first semester. The application form shall be submitted to the superintendent’s office of the AAESA for processing.
6. The parent(s)/guardian(s) shall be responsible for all transportation of their children to and from school.
7. If your child is eligible for special education programs or services, the enrolling district shall be considered the district responsible for developing and implementing an individualized education plan (IEP) annually.
